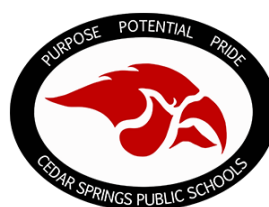

GHOST SHIP

The merchant ship "Mary Celeste" set sail on November 7, 1872, from New York City, loaded with cargo of commercial alcohol heading for Genoa, Italy. The ship never reached its destination, and on December 4 of the same year, was spotted 600 miles west of Gibraltar floating aimlessly about. After boarding the ship, the rescuers discovered to their shock and amazement, that everyone on board had completely vanished! Theories abound as to what happened to the crew, including an explosion, pirates, a seaquake, or bad weather; however, to this day, no one knows.

FINALE FROM THE FIREBIRD

The Firebird was first performed at the Paris Opera in June 1910 and was immediately well received. The piece not only put Stravinsky on the map as one of the most important composers of the early 20th century but is also considered one of his greatest works.

AMERICAN DECLARATION

American Declaration is a fanfare that uses America (My Country 'Tis of Thee) as its primary melodic material. Several patriotic tunes (Yankee Doodle, The Star Spangled Banner, etc.) are woven in and hinted at. The piece is intended to serve as a stately concert opener or a nice patriotic moment at any performance.

DOWN BY THE SALLEY GARDENS

Down By The Salley Gardens is a poem by William Butler Yeats published in *The Wanderings of Oisín and Other Poems* in 1889. The tune is an old Irish air. A salley is a willow tree, and a weir is a low dam head. Commonly, water flows freely over the top of the weir crest before cascading down to the lower level.

CONCERT ETIQUETTE

A performer's intense concentration can be interrupted by little things that may seem trivial to audience members. The following suggestions will help audience members show respect to the performers on stage as well as other members of the audience. This will help the performers to do their best.

When To Applaud - Performers always appreciate applause, but there are appropriate moments to applaud. In a multi-movement work, applaud after all movements are completed. This allows the continuity of the piece to flow from one movement to the next. "Hooting and hollering" is not appropriate in the concert setting.

Arrival Time - Leave early and allow enough time for parking and traffic. If you do arrive late, wait by the doors until the first piece (not just a movement) is finished, then discreetly take the nearest seat available.

Entering and Exiting the Auditorium - Never enter or exit the auditorium during a performance. If you must enter or exit, please wait until the performance on stage has been completed. The most appropriate times to move about are during audience applause or set changes.

Talking - Talking should not be tolerated. It is not only distracting to the performer, but to every person in the audience. It is unacceptable to talk (even whispering can be heard) during a musical performance. If someone around you is talking, ask them nicely to please stop.

Other Noises - Avoid rustling your program, tapping your foot, bouncing your legs, etc. Pagers and cell phones should be turned off. Watches set to beep on the hour should also be turned off. These high-pitched beeps are distracting to the performers and audience members.

Coughing - It is hard to avoid a spontaneous cough. Be prepared with some type of cough drops or candies. Avoid cellophane wrappers. Many come with a soft wax-paper wrapping that will be much less noisy.

Taking Pictures - Refrain from taking any flash photography and be sure sound is off during a performance. The click of a camera and especially the flash are very distracting. Pictures should be taken after the performance.

Children - Children need exposure to good music and live performances. If your young child begins to get restless in the middle of a performance, it may be best that you exit the auditorium until calmer times prevail.

By following basic etiquette of respect and consideration, performers and the audience will have a more pleasurable and meaningful experience as they perform and attend live concerts. Because they have worked so hard for their performance, the students on stage deserve to be treated with respect.

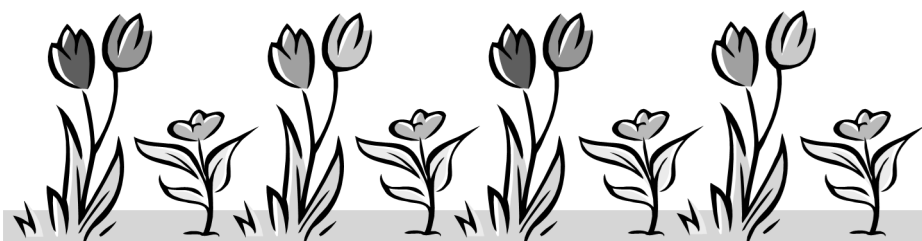

When writing for young band, I always ask myself, "what would I have LOVED to play at that age?" My younger self would have relished this mental image, and I hope your young band students will too.

BACK TO THE FUTURE

Back To The Future is a specially arranged work that allows your second-year players to experience the thrilling music that contributed so much to the success of this movie hit. Here is a great-sounding, easy-to-play version of this classic movie theme with limited ranges and easy rhythms.

AT TWILIGHT

Today we live in a world of chaos and noise. Often, we find ourselves racing between work, family, travel, school, etc., so much that we tend to lose track of how quickly life is going by. Amidst all this chaos, I try to find time each day to relax and reflect on life itself, oftentimes in the evening at twilight as the noise of the world around me fades into silence. STARSPLITTER FANFARE

As its name implies, **Starsplitter Fanfare** is a spirited and powerful work inspired by the phenomenon known as a supernova. These stellar explosions can be extremely bright and cause a burst of radiation that outshines an entire galaxy for a few weeks or months before fading. In addition, they can radiate as much energy as the sun would over its entire lifespan. These supernovae are estimated to occur approximately once every 50 years in a galaxy the size of the Milky Way. In addition to the amazing explosion, the resulting shock waves can trigger the formation of new stars. The amazing concept that such an incredible explosion can cause new formations in the sky underscores the energy of this entire work.

SAMBA DE SOLEIL

Samba de Soleil (dance of the sun) is a tribute to the annual Brazilian Carnival (or... Carnival). The yearly Carnival, which occurs for five days immediately preceding Ash Wednesday, is Brazil's most famous holiday and has become an event of enormous proportions. Millions of people join the festivities yearly as the country erupts in music, samba dancing, flamboyant costumes, and massive parades.

PIRATES OF THE CARIBBEAN MEDLEY

From the 2003 Walt Disney Pictures blockbuster **Pirates of the Caribbean: The Curse of Black Pearl** comes a fun young band arrangement of two of the most well-known themes in the Pirates Franchise. The Medallion Calls can be heard as the introductory theme of Captain Jack Sparrow, while He's A Pirate is the main action theme. This challenging young band tune will prepare your audience for a swashbuckling good time.
